## October Trustee Report - Ward 4

Sept 27 Board Meeting highlights:
Lots of reports and presentations brought us great updates on the events happening across the division, including the summer.

Summer School this year generated 5744 credits! This is $20 \%$ more than last year. Many programs both in person in Leduc and Beaumont along with some online programs. Very successful!

MHCB Team - Mental Health Capacity Building team - many programs offered over 7 weeks in 4 of our school communities - New Sarepta, Calmar, Beaumont, Leduc. 491 students/families participated in day camps, events, picnics and park pop ups! These are always well attended and registrations are full within minutes of opening. The Team is exploring ways to increase access to the summer camps they offer

EDMS is now hosting an EAL Pre K program in Beaumont. English as an additional language allows for early entry support for students prior to entering school. The program is at full capacity with 18 students. Fun fact - given that we have always been a predominantly French community, do you know what the second most commonly spoken language is in Beaumont? Punjabi. With our ever changing community and rapid growth, our Board is making great efforts to support our diverse community.

The search for a new Superintendent has resumed. Applications are being accepted and the goal is to have the position filled by the end of December when Mr. Romanchuk retires.

Our meeting with the three MLAs on September 15 was an excellent event. The trustees were able to present some projects which the MLAs could advocate to the government for us. The Collegiate School planned for Calmar is a top priority. It will be a trades school allowing students to complete high school with the first year of an apprenticeship completed. This program will be open to students throughout Black Gold. The project is approved, it's just stalled in some "red tape".

Your trustees will be endeavoring to attend as many council meetings as we can over the school year, please feel free to reach out to either of us if you have any questions or concerns.

October Trustee Report - Ward 4 October 2023 Highlights:
The Board met with Leduc County Councillors at the beginning of October to exchange ideas and to strengthen the relationship we have with them. We were privileged to also meet with the MESC Board (Maskwacis Educational Schools Commission) and their superintendent. One of the Board's priorities is to deepen our understanding of Indigenous Culture and we are hoping that this meeting will result in some cross division opportunities for their students and our students to connect.

COSC event - The Board sponsored this event at the MacLab Theater on October 25 for all school council members and school administrators. The ASCA presentation focused on improving Parental Engagement. Every parent in a school is part of the school council and yet, it's difficult to grow the attendance at local school meetings and the participation of parents. Research shows that parental involvement in a child's school translates to better academic achievement. After this event elections for the CoSC executive was held and all positions were filled. The next meetings for board chairs will be on January 17, 2024.

School tours this month found the trustees interacting with staff and students in Calmar and some of the Leduc Schools.

Interviews for the Superintendent position are nearing conclusion. The pool of applicants was wide and the Board has shortlisted suitable candidates. Interviews are continuing.

The October Board meeting was held on November 1st. After much consultation, review and debate, the Board provided direction on the Reconfiguration of the Leduc schools with the new Ohpaho Secondary School opening in September 2024. Both Leduc High Schools will house students in grades 8-12. The principal of Opaho is Dan Lake.

Board planning is currently underway. Two days (November 8, 9) are set aside to review the budget and compare it to the projections made in the spring. The Board's Strategic Plan for the coming year was created and the monthly Board Work Plan was examined. The AERR (Annual Education Results Report) will be reviewed tomorrow. This looks back at the provincial test results, and the Assurance Measures results. Each of the department leads will present an overview of their strategic plans as well.

After a very busy October and multiple meetings already in November, the trustees are looking forward to a short break next week. We sincerely wish all of our students and staff and their families a chance to rest and refuel for the coming months.

We, as your trustees, are endeavoring to attend as many council meetings and school events as we can throughout the school year. Please feel free to reach out to either of us at any time.
